## EEO1Source available to members

KAB has purchased EEO1Source for use by member stations. KAB is in a position to offer this free service due to the success of KAB's NCSA program and stations continuing to air and report NCSAs.

For information on EEO1Source, go to [www.eeo1source.com](http://www.eeo1source.com). There is an online tutorial at [www.eeo1source.com/help](http://www.eeo1source.com/help). When you're ready to begin use of this program, go ahead and sign up and KAB will approve and confirm your KAB membership with the webmaster.

EEO1Source is a web-based system for EEO compliance and record-keeping. The service is available to station members who have paid their 2004 dues. The only cost to stations will be faxing charges which should amount to no more than \$120 per year, depending on the number of job openings.

The service is secure and password-protected. EEO1Source will: automatically send job opening information via fax to Prong 1 and Prong 2 agencies; allow stations to customize the send-to list for each specific opening; track other out-reach efforts such as on-air and print ads; track the entire interview and hiring process along with referral sources; maintain a job specific file of all hiring processes; track Prong 3 menu items; provide stations with the required self-assessment in a verifiable way; allow stations to generate "mock" reports in the proper FCC form; generate all the required FCC reports in their proper form ready for copying on to FCC online forms; create the necessary public file reports; and automatically create the FCC-required web page.

Claude was honored with the Sonny Slater Award for outstanding community involvement several years ago by the KAB.

## Check your KAB inspection certificate

If the expiration date on your Certificate of Compliance is in 2004, start thinking about signing up for another inspection. The advantage to KAB's alternative inspection program, is that stations which pass get a three-year exemption on routine FCC inspections. Go to [www.kab.net/members/services/index](http://www.kab.net/members/services/index) to download the information and form to request an inspection, or contact KAB.

A reminder – **your station may be “marked” for an FCC inspection** if you do not have a current KAB Certificate of Compliance or have not signed up for a KAB alternate inspection.

### More pass inspection

These stations have recently passed a KAB Alternate Broadcast Inspection, gaining a three-year exemption from routine FCC inspections: **WIBW AM/FM, Topeka; and KFDI FM, KICT FM, KYQQ FM, KMXW FM, Wichita.**

## KAB Foundation to fund scholarships

It's official. The IRS has approved KAB's application for a 501 (c) (3) foundation. The purpose of the KAB Foundation is exclusively for scholarships, student aid, charitable, and educational purposes.

The long range goal of the KAB Foundation is to build an endowment for broadcast scholarships and internships. Contributions are sought from radio and television stations, broadcasters, advertisers, other foundations and estates.

### Get EEO Credit

To make a contribution to the foundation and get one credit for EEO for non-job specific outreach, make a station check payable to KAB Foundation Broadcast Scholarship. (See contribution schedule in number 2 below).

In order to get one credit, each station employment unit (SEU) should:

- 1) once every two years, donate to the KAB Foundation (earmarked for broadcast scholarships) a minimum of \$100 for radio SEUs with 1 or 2 stations, a minimum of \$200 for radio SEUs with three or more stations, and a minimum of \$300 for TV SEUs;
- 2) promote the availability of the scholarship program over the SEU's stations and direct interested candidates to mail, fax or e-mail the station for a copy of the application (KAB is producing radio and television announcements promoting our Broadcast Scholarship Program; the spots will be available in a couple weeks);
- 3) provide blank application forms upon request, which the KAB will provide or you may access on our web site: [www.kab.net/programs/student/brdcast\\_scholarship.html](http://www.kab.net/programs/student/brdcast_scholarship.html)
- 4) be available to answer questions about the program from interested persons, and
- 5) make an initial evaluation of the candidates for the evaluation committee

The application deadline for the broadcast scholarship each year is May 1.

## Community service deadline extended

The Community Service Survey conducted every other year by NAB and the 50 state broadcast associations arrived at stations in January. If you haven't responded, you'll receive a follow-up survey. The **deadline has been extended to February 27** so please take the time to complete it.

The 2002 survey results showed broadcasters across the country contributed \$9.9 billion in service to their communities. The total for Kansas broadcasters was \$111.3 million.

Members of the board of directors of the Kansas Sunshine Coalition for Open Government met recently with the state's legislative leadership. Representatives of the Kansas Sunshine Coalition for Open Government (KSCOG), Kansas Press Association (KPA) and Kansas Association of Broadcasters (KAB) met with Speaker of the House Doug Mays prior to the beginning of the 2004 session, to discuss the legislative review of the exceptions to open records in Kansas. ## Ted McCoy writes

Wayne Grabbe, KRSL/KCAY in Russell, forwarded this note from Ted McCoy:

“KRSL Radio in Russell KS went on the air 48 years ago, Jan 11, 1956. I was a student at Ft Hays and went to work part time two days later. Worked part time till summer then full time till going on to K State that fall. Manager was Bill Scott sales manager was Jan Dellinger the other announcer was Eddie Sherman. A high school kid named Donnie Dundas hung around emptying wastebaskets and whatever for an excuse to be there. He later died on the atomic sub Thresher which went down in the Atlantic with all hands. Dellinger was married to Miss Kansas 1942 whose poster size picture was in the lobby of the theatre in Wichita where they had the contest at that time. That summer a baby tornado toppled the tower into the roof of the building but we were back on the air in hours. I got to interview a "celebrity" that summer.. the Duke of Paducah. (Where you going Duke? I'm going back to the wagon, Ted, these shoes are killing me) Became very fond of a couple girls Jolene and Pat for two. It was quite a year for a small town kid. It was the beginning of 47 years in radio TV, until I became legally blind and had to hang it up a couple years ago. So Happy Birthday to KRSL... and those who run the joint.” Ted McCoy

## Dale McCoy, Jr.



Dale W. McCoy Jr. died December 24, 2003 at St. Francis Hospital in Wichita. He graduated from Wichita High School East in 1943. He served in the U.S. Air Force from 1943 to 1946 as a First Lieutenant.

Dale received a degree in Business Administration from Wichita University in 1950. During his college career he worked as a Merchandising Manager for his father, Dale McCoy, Sr., at KFBI Radio (now KFDD). Dale and Eleanor Rice were married on August 10, 1948 and are the parents of one daughter and four sons: Cathi, Michael, Marc, Tim and Dale III.

Dale began his radio career in sales for KGNO in Dodge City and later moved to KVGB Radio in Great Bend. In 1957 he returned to Wichita as sales manager for KANS Radio. One year later Dale was named station manager for KAKE Radio and Vice President of KAKE Radio and Television Corporation.

Dale purchased his first radio station, KCRB, Chanute in 1968. He founded Neosho County Broadcasting Co., Inc. The company owns KKOY AM/FM in Chanute and KSNP FM in Burlington and formerly owned and operated radio stations in Salina, El Dorado, and Rolla, Missouri.

Dale served numerous community organizations in Wichita and Chanute. He has been recognized by many organizations, and has received numerous community awards.

Dale served the radio industry for over 55 years. He was president of the KAB in 1967-68 and he served on the KAB Board and chaired numerous KAB committees for over 30 years. The University of Kansas honored Dale with the Grover Cobb Award for Broadcasting Service in 1980. The KAB honored Dale with their highest award - the KAB's Distinguished Service Award – in 1984. He was inducted in KAB's Hall of Fame in 2000.

Services were held December 27 in Wichita and January 3 in Chanute.

Memorial contributions may be made to Neosho Regional Medical Center in Chanute.

## Claude Hughes



Claude Hughes died December 28, 2003, at a St. Francis Hospital in Wichita. He was 77.

Claude was born in Mindenmines, MO. He graduated from

Lamar High School in Lamar, MO and attended Central Radio and Television School in Kansas City where he received his Telephone Operators License. He enlisted in the US Air Corp in 1945 and served in Japan. He achieved the rank of sergeant.

He married Portteus Corporon in 1948. Claude was hired as chief engineer of KNEX, McPherson in 1949 which began broadcasting in an old farmhouse. He also was a disc jockey with an on-air name of “Cousin Claude”. He was named general manager of KNEX in 1956, a position he held until the station sold in the early 1980s. The FM was added in the 1970s allowing live broadcast of high school and college sports. For many years, Claude was the “Voice of the Bullpups”.

Claude returned to the stations – KNGI/KBBE – when Jerry and Diane Davies purchased the stations. Claude worked in sales and programming for the Davies, and eventually as general manager again. In 1999 he celebrated 50 years in broadcasting.

Claude was a member of First Christian Church in McPherson, American Legion, VFW, Barbershoppers, Historical Society and McPherson Opera House Preservation Co.

KAB presented the Sonny Slater Award to Claude in 2000 for his many years of service to his stations and community.

Claude is survived by his wife and five children – Belinda, Steve, Timothy, Lisa, and Kirby – eight grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.

Services were held January 2 at First Christian Church. Memorial contributions may be made to the sound system fund, at First Christian Church in McPherson.

The stations held a tribute for Claude on January 30 to commemorate his life and contribution to radio, in conjunction with the AM's 55<sup>th</sup> anniversary open house.

## Washington update

### At the FCC

\*The FCC held its second in a series of **localism hearings** in San Antonio recently. All five Commissioners were on hand to hear the testimony of broadcasters, critics of the broadcast industry such as NAACP, Parents Television Council, and professional musicians and third-party beneficiaries such as the Salvation Army, parents of abducted children, hospitals and other non-profits. The next hearing is scheduled for Santa Cruz/Salinas, CA in March.

\*The FCC requested that the NAB mail copies of the FTC's brochure to all NAB member stations **to help the media screen for clear-cut deceptive weight loss claims in advertising**. The brochure provides hints for spotting egregiously false claims in weight loss product advertising. The guide is also available at the FTC's web site: [www.ftc.gov/bcp/menu-ads.htm](http://www.ftc.gov/bcp/menu-ads.htm).

### In Congress

\*The Senate voted 61 to 32 to pass a measure to invoke cloture for the omnibus appropriations bill, which cleared the way for final passage of the legislation. Kansas Senators Sam Brownback and Pat Roberts both voted in favor of the measure. The legislation includes a **provision instructing the FCC to set the national television viewership cap at 39%**. The House passed the bill in December.

\*The House Subcommittee on Telecommunications held a hearing on January 28, on **the FCC's enforcement of indecency rules**. Subcommittee Chairman Fred Upton (R-MI) promised to fast track his legislation (HR 3717) to increase indecency fines to \$275,000 per violation - up to \$3 million for continuing violations - by television and radio broadcasters who transmit obscene, indecent and profane language. The bill is endorsed by President Bush and has 37 co-sponsors. Commerce Committee Chairman Billy Tauzin (R-LA) intends to swiftly pass HR 3717 out of committee. The Senate Commerce Committee plans a hearing on indecency the week of February 9.

## News briefs
